## **AGGIE LINGO**

Your A-Z guide to understanding your student's new vocabulary and helping them to be familiar with common used words in the Aggie community.

## NMSU LINGO

- Academic advisor: Staff member who helps students develop a plan to achieve their educational goals.
- Academic calendar: Important dates for the academic year, such as the start and end of a semester.



- Activity Center (the AC): Fitness and recreation center for students, employees, and other members of the NMSU community.
- Add/drop: Administrative action to add or drop a class.
- Aggie Ca\$h: NMSU ID card connected to an Aggie Ca\$h account for use at campus food vendors, some vending machines, Pan American Center, and other outlets.
- Aggie ID: Student identification number coded into NMSU ID cards that is required to check out books and for access to services such as the Activity Center, athletic events, and Campus Health.
- Aggie Memorial Stadium: Athletics stadium where the Aggie football team plays, dedicated to students who have served in the military.
- Alumni: A graduate or former student of NMSU.
- ASNMSU: NMSU's student government.
- Barnes and Noble Bookstore: The Bookstore is located inside the Auxiliary Services Building at University Avenue and Jordan Street. Sells course textbooks, general books, school supplies, and Aggie merchandise.
- Branson Library: Located near the east end of the Frenger Mall, Branson is the older of NMSU's two libraries.
- Canvas: Interactive web-based, learning management system that provides tools to support learning, such as grade books, assignments, and syllabus.

- Academic Catalog: A book published each year that provides information on courses, majors, minors, and academic policies.
- Challenge Coin: A coin presented to incoming students from the NMSU President as a symbol to achieve success and graduate in four years.
- Chancellor: Head of the NMSU system.
- o **College**: A collection of related departments headed by a Dean.
- o **Commencement**: Ceremony celebrating the completion of academic degrees.
- Community colleges: Colleges that offer associate's degrees, community education, and developmental coursework. The NMSU system includes four community colleges: NMSU-Alamogordo, NMSU-Carlsbad, Doña Ana Community College, and NMSU-Grants.

- Cooperative employment (Co-op): Employment that provides practical work experience that complements a student's education.
- Corbett Center Student Union (Corbett, CCSU): Building on the International Mall and home to student services, food vendors, and gathering areas.
- Credit hours: A unit of academic credit roughly equal to the amount of time spent in a class during a week.
- Crimson Kick-off: A series of academic and social events that welcome students and help them learn about campus life and resources.
- Crimson Scholar: Recognition program for top students; benefits include early registration, extended library check-out, work-study opportunities, and transcript recognition.
- o **CRN (course reference number)**: Identification number for a course that changes each semester and is required for registration.
- Dean: Academic official, in charge of a college.
- o **Degree requirements**: Courses that must be completed to earn a degree.

- Department: The office for a specific academic discipline (such as Art, Anthropology, Music) that offers degree programs.
- Developmental courses: Courses offered by a community college that could be required prior to enrollment in other courses.
- Distance education: Courses delivered via web-based technologies, interactive television (ITV), faculty exchanges, and off-site classes.
- Educational Services Building: Near the Pan American Center at the east end of the International Mall, this building house Financial Aid, University Admissions, Family Outreach, University Accounts Receivable, and University Registrar.
- EFC (expected family contribution): Amount calculated by the FAFSA that a family is expected to contribute to a student's education costs.
- o **Elective**: A course that is required for a degree but that a student can choose.
- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid): Federal form that calculates eligibility for financial aid.
- Fees: Portion of your university expenses that pay for services like the Health Center and Aggie Transit.
- o **Finals**: Typically, comprehensive exams given during the last week of the semester that cover material from the entire semester.
- Financial aid: Money from various sources (grants, loans, scholarships) that can help students pay for school; might require repayment.
- Frenger Food Court: The collection of independent food vendors near the east end of the Frenger Mall.
- Frenger Mall: Walkway that extends from Espina Street to Zuhl Library.
- o **GPA (grade point average)**: A calculation of the total number of grade points earned in courses divided by the total number of credits awarded.
- Greek Life: Fraternities and sororities providing social interaction and community services.
- Hadley Hall: Located at the top of the Horseshoe, the President, Provost, and other administrators have offices there.

- Hold: Administrative block that prevents registration. Action by the student is required to clear the hold.
- Honors College: The academic home of courses that emphasize personal growth, critical thinking, leadership, independence, curiosity, and social responsibility.
- o Horseshoe (Pride Field): The large grassy area west of Hadley Hall.
- o Inter-collegiate sports: Athletic teams that represent NMSU in NCAA sports.
- International Mall (I-Mall): Walkway that runs from Hadley Hall to the Pan American Center.
- Intramural sports: Athletic teams that play for fun in a league where all players are NMSU students.
- Keystone: Pistol Pete's one and only sidekick. What cowboy is complete without his horse?
- Land-grant Institution: University designation related to the Morrill Act. Land-grants were initially charged with teaching agriculture, military tactics, the mechanical arts, and classical studies to members of the working classes.
- LLC (Living Learning Community): Community of students who live together in a residence hall based upon common academic interests.
- Lottery Scholarship: Scholarship for some New Mexico residents created by the New Mexico Legislature and funded by proceeds from New Mexico Lottery Tickets.
- Major: Primary course of study for undergraduate students.
- Memorial Tower: Part of an earlier Aggie Memorial Stadium, built to remember students who died serving our country. The Tower was incorporated into the Health and Social Services Building.
- Midterms: Exams given during the semester (see Finals).
- Mini-semester: Accelerated courses offered in half the time of a typical semester.
- Minor: Secondary course of study for undergraduate students.
- myNMSU: Online access to registration, grades, Banner, email, time sheets, online learning, and other services.

- Online course: Course in which content is delivered online.
- Pan American Center: Location of Commencement, sports, concerts, and other large events.
- Pistol Pete: NMSU's mascot, Pete is a mustachioed cowboy who loves his ranch and cheering on his Aggies.
- Pre-requisite: Course required before enrollment in a subsequent course.
- President: Senior NMSU administrator and head of the NMSU-Las Cruces campus.
- Promissory note: A written agreement to pay back a loan.

## GUIDANCE AND GOOD PRACTICE

- o **Provost**: Senior academic administrator, second to the NMSU President.
- Required course: Course that is required for a degree.
- Resident Assistant: Trained student leader who assists in overseeing students living in a residence hall
- Resident Director: Staff member that lives within a residence hall and oversees RAs and other residents
- o **Residence Hall**: NMSU's term for a dormitory.
- Scholar Dollar\$: NMSU's online application for scholarships.
- Scholarship: Money that can help pay for school, usually requires an application, and does not have to be paid back.
- STAR Degree audit: System that compares courses students have taken against degree requirements.
- Striking the Wonder Dog: An NMSU icon at football games who retrieves the kicking tee and steals the hearts of game attendees
- Syllabus: Course document typically containing assignments, schedule, grading, and class policies.

- o **Taos**: All-you-care-to eat buffet-style dining area located on the first floor of Corbett Center Student Union, open seven days a week while school is in session.
- o **Transcript**: Official academic record of courses and grades.
- o **Tuition**: Portion of your university expenses that goes toward the cost of your courses.
- Withdraw: Administrative process to drop a class after the drop date or to leave the university for the semester.
- Work-study: Financial aid resource that provides funds that may be earned by eligible students for work.
- Zuhl Library: The second of two libraries on campus, located at the east end of Frenger Mall.
